## Large Grants Fund

#### Four applications were reviewed:

- 1. Exeter Communities Together
- 2. Estuary Community Hub
- 3. Co Create Exeter
- 4. Exeter Community Responders

This funding is to support building or refurbishment costs or the purchase of equipment. Groups need to demonstrate a minimum of 50% match funding (unless in a priority community).

The Large Grants Budget for the 2022/23 financial year is £60,000. Throughout this year, £42,000 has been awarded to date, leaving a budget of £18,000 remaining third and final round for the year.

#### **Small Grants Fund**

The Exeter Small Grants Fund will support groups and organisations with a one-off grant of up to £2,000 to help run events, festivals and projects that aim to encourage community participation. This fund can also be used for a one-off purchase or repair of equipment.

Awards will be for a maximum of 80% of the funding target. Applications are reviewed on a monthly basis, with no closing date.

The Small Grants Budget for the 2022/23 financial year is £50,000. Throughout this year, £40,315 has been awarded to date and £4,000 re-allocated to the Warm Spaces Fund, leaving a budget of £5,685 remaining seventh and final round for the year.
